Directions to Glimmerglass State Park:

From the west: Thruway (I-90) east to exit 30 at Herkimer. Route 28 south to Richfield Springs. Route 20 east to East Springfield. County Route 31 south to park entrance

From the east: Thruway (I-90) west to exit 25A to I-88. One exit on I-88 to Duanesburg-Cooperstown exit. Route 20 west to East Springfield, County Rte. 31 south to park entrance.

Johan Adam Kilts

Adam Kilts was born August 27, 1730 in Germany and immigrated to Stone Arabia

about 1735. He served in the militia during the French & Indian War. He was in the company of Soffrines Deychert 1757 to march to Fort William Henry. Another militia service by order of Sir William Johnson 24, July 1763 was to German Flats.

Adam Kilts was naturalized with Peter Kilts, Johannes Kilts, Johan Nekeel Kiltz and others 20 March 1762 (Colonial Laws of New York vol 4) He married Catharina Franck June 16, 1765. She was born 19 February 1743 in Palatine, Montgomery Co, NY.

During the Revolution, he served as an enlisted man under Col. Jacob Klock in the 2nd regiment of the Tryon County Militia. Adam was a private in the companies of Captain Klock and Captain Suts. He collected his pay for his service (New York State Archives).

Adam and Catharina were members of the Stone Arabia Reformed congregation and were sponsors for several baptisms. Adam was on a list for a call for a minister with other members of the Reformed congregation. In 1788, Adam was a Deacon in the Stone Arabia Reformed Church and on a list of seat owners for that church. His name was also on a list for work on the high roads and on a tax list in Palatine. The 1790 census list in Palatine, Montgomery County has Adam with 1 male over 16, 4 males under 16 and 5 females.

Adam and Catharina moved from Stone Arabia about 1800 to Sharon, Schoharie County. Roscoe's History of Schoharie County stated that "the old gentleman (Adam) brought the boards with him from Stone Arabia to build a house. The farm was located less than a mile north of Sharon Hill on the road to Argusville. The 1810 census lists at Sharon, Schoharie County: Adam Kelts with 1 male over 45, 1 female over 45, 1 male 16-26 and 1 female 16-26. Adam died sometime after 1810. He and his wife were buried on their farm. Between 1895 & 1900, they and Maria Ball were disinterred. All 3 bodies were placed in one coffin and reinterred in Sharon's Slate Hill Cemetery with 1 stone – Maria Ball's name on it. Adam & Catharine's stones have disappeared.

Their children were born near Stone Arabia.
